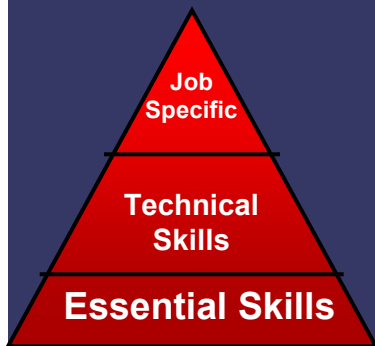




Beyond the Barriers Returning to Employment

What will this program do?

- Build up your Essential Skills
- Give hands-on experience in some construction trades and service industry jobs including Carpentry and Culinary Arts
- Qualifications in several industry certificates
- Provide practical experience placements



Essential Skills are the skills needed for work, learning and life. They provide the foundation for learning all other skills and enable people to evolve with their jobs and adapt to workplace change.

Through the Métis Skills Employment Centre, MNBC will deliver a program specifically for the **Aboriginal clients** who have had trouble maintaining or obtaining long term secured employment.

This program will be 12 weeks, with a 2 – 4 week practicum and will include:

- *Essential Skills and TOWES Testing and Assessments*
- *Intro to Computers*
- *Numeracy Upgrading*
- *Career Exploration*
- *One on one counseling with Job Support Coaching*
- *Culinary introduction*
- *Intro to trades CORE Program*
- *Certificates in World Host (formerly Super Host),*
- *Several industry safety certificates*
- *Resume Preparation/Interview Skills*
- *Job Placement Practicum's*
- *Continuing support for after program job placement and retention*

This program is designed to assist **Aboriginal people** that are having trouble getting and keeping sustainable employment. The program is specifically designed to help individuals move forward past their personal blocks that stop their positive growth. Support throughout and after the program is designed to keep the participants on track and make sure that issues that are hindering their success are minimized. This support along with skill building, real world practical experience and industry required certificates will help Aboriginal people move **Beyond the Barriers**.
